

How to differentiate the learning environment

- Respectful tasks
- Flexible groupings
- Flexible work space
- Individual learning goals
- Tools and toys (i.e. devices, massage ball etc.)

How to Differentiate the Content


- Beginning with the curriculum Expectations
- Assess what the child already knows and what the child can do
 - This can range from informal formative assessments to formalized assessments of students understanding

Teach by theme to allow cross curricular connections

How to differentiate process

- The focus is on the "how" of instruction
- Process: means adjusting instructional approaches to match the needs of the students using high yield strategies (Gradual Release of Responsibility, Oral Language and Social Interaction as Scaffolds for Learning, Consider Learning Styles/Preferences)
- Vygotsky Zone of Proximal Development
- Eric Jensen Brain Growth: Challenge and Feedback
